

What is Health Literacy?

Definition:

Health literacy: The ability to obtain, process, and understand health information to make informed healthcare decisions.

Relevance

Critical for parents navigating autism services. Impact on service use and child outcomes.

Research Methodology

Mixed Methods:



Quantitative: Surveys measuring parent health literacy and autism service utilization.



Qualitative: Interviews/focus groups exploring parental experiences.

Key Quantitative Findings (Data)


Health Literacy Levels:

 Emphasis on communication strategies tailored to different literacy levels.


Support Systems:
